The Powers of Darkness Resisted This Mission from the Start



Although Wednesday, the first day of the festival, was cancelled, many came out Thursday, thirsty and hungry for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. 24,598 made a decision for Christ the first night, and by the end of the festival 102,788 decisions had been recorded.



We Encountered Tremendous Resistance at the Border

We also saw tremendous resistance in getting our visas to even be able to enter the country of Congo. We stood in faith with our partners that we would be able to hold this mission in Bukavu. The Lord honored our prayers; our passports and visas were delivered to us with about an hour to spare. We had struggles with finances, sickness, weather, corruption in the government, and even in some of the churches; but by the strength of the Spirit we pushed through.

Festival Cancelled Due to Lack of Power

The senior immigration officer at the Congolese border would not permit our sound system and generator into the country, and because of the delay our first night of the festival was cancelled.

Our team prayed fervently, trusting that God would make a way. The Lord came though, and we had the sound system and power the next 4 days of the festival.

Our team grew dramatically in our ability to trust God in difficult situations, and we ultimately saw God do an amazing work during this mission. We thank God for His miraculous work!

The Crowd Uniting Through Prayer

In all our collective years of ministry, none of us had ever seen anything like what God did during the closing prayer the last night of our festival in Bukavu, the Democratic Republic of the Congo. It was so powerful that words fail to describe what happened. This seemed to be a foretaste of Jesus' Kingdom, as Jesus described it in Mark 9:1, "I tell you the truth, some standing here right now will not die before they see the Kingdom of God arrive in great power!"

What an Electrifying Atmosphere!

Everyone was aware that the anointing of the Holy Spirit was building as Rob Welch preached the Gospel to the largest crowd ever assembled at a For His Glory festival. It was this strong anointing that drew the most fruitful ingathering of souls to Christ. As the festival was drawing to a close Rob called Mark forward to close the festival in prayer. As he approached the podium you could feel the air was alive with the tangible presence of the Holy Spirit.

We Saw the Kingdom of God Manifest in Power the Last Night

Mark Levesque began his prayer by calling for the Kingdom of God to come in manifestation. He prayed, "Our Father Who art in heaven, holy is Your Name! Lord God almighty, let Your Kingdom come in full manifestation in this place in great power and glory," and it did! Mark Levesque declared over the crowd that they were kings under the Lord Jesus, and that they have authority in His name to bring forth God's Kingdom in this city for Christ. God answered the prayer mightily as the weight of His glorious presence fell upon all of us.

Spiritual Unity Came Over Those in Attendance at the Festival

As we looked over the huge gathering of people huddled together in the stadium, we knew they were receiving a very tangible reality of God's Kingdom in our midst.
