Because of the likely persecution from their family the two young ladies ran away to the home of a pastor that Grace had met and his family.

Because that situation did not work out, Grace's sister moved back home with their birth family, but Grace, knowing that God had other plans for her, moved into an abandoned building in a deserted part of town. It was here that she began what she calls "jungle ministry" and began evangelizing drug addicts and petty criminals. She also began to hear from God that her God given identity was much more than an inferior runaway girl which was the identity the world had given her.

Grace met her husband at the ministry the Lord directed her to when she moved into the abandoned building. God told her husband to marry her after hearing her testimony of a transformed life. They were married in 2014 and have 4 children, including a teenage girl that they adopted. Grace praises God for the miracle of her husband who has "freely allowed her to serve God" in her God given identity of being a leader. She is also a unifier and hears regularly from the Lord on what to do next. This is just one glimpse of women who has been transformed by Jesus through the T4T training in Africa and being obedient to how God has called her. There are stories like this from every city where we have seen movements launched. In Tanzania, a once fearful Muslim woman receives Christ and leads her entire family to Christ. In Rwanda, a former prostitute attends T4T training and discovers she is really a child of God with a mission.

God is not just changing the lives of these women through showing them their new identity, He is using these women in very powerful ways to lead other women, men, youth, prostitutes, Muslims, and others to find their new identity with Jesus.
